

## QUALITY ASSURANCE POLICY PEER ASSESSMENT SELECTION CRITERIA

The College's Quality Assurance (QA) program allows for a peer assessor to be appointed to assess a registrant's practice, including the registrant's knowledge, skill, and judgment.

The College's QA regulation provides that a registrant will be referred for a peer and practice assessment if:

- 1. The registrant is randomly selected.
- 2. A request is made to review the registrant's QA records (self-assessment, continuing education or professional development records), and the records are incomplete or fail to demonstrate that the registrant has engaged in adequate QA activities.
- 3. The registrant is selected on the basis of other criteria specified by the QA Committee and published on the College's website for at least three months before the registrant is selected on the basis of that criteria.

The QA Committee has specified the following additional criteria for a peer and practice assessment:

- 1. The registrant has failed to submit or fully complete their professional portfolio.
- 2. The registrant has failed to fulfil terms, conditions, and limitations imposed by the Registration Committee or Registrar or agreed to by the registrant.

A registrant who has been selected for a peer and practice assessment will receive a notice at least 14 days before the assessment begins.
