*CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Article 7.2 of the COO's by-laws states that a COO committee member has a duty to avoid conflicts of interest, and to comply with the code of conduct set out in **Schedule D** to the by-laws.

A conflict of interest exists where a reasonable member of the public would conclude that a Director or Committee Member's personal, professional or financial interest, relationship or affiliation may affect their judgment or the discharge of their duties to the College. A conflict of interest may be real or perceived, actual or potential, or direct or indirect.

It will usually constitute a conflict of interest for a committee member to:

- hold a responsible position such as director, owner, board member or officer, or to be an employee of an organization of or for opticians that has as its primary mandate the promotion of the opticianry profession: see **Schedule D, Appendix I, section 8(i)** of the by-laws; or
- hold a responsible position such as director, owner, board member or officer, or to be an employee of any organization where their duties may be reasonably seen as influencing their judgment in the matter. For example, an educator in a school should not participate in any decisions relating to the status of that school, its program(s) or the acceptability for registration of graduates from that school: see **Schedule D, Appendix I, section 8(j)** of the by-laws.
