

# **REGISTRATION POLICY**

Non-Practising Status

The purpose of this policy is to establish a fair process for registrants who are not practising in Ontario, but who wish to maintain their registration with the College of Opticians of Ontario (COO), while ensuring delivery of high quality, safe and ethical opticianry care to the public of Ontario.

#### Scope

This policy applies to all Registered Opticians. It does not apply to Registered Student Opticians or Registered Intern Opticians.

### Background

It is a requirement that all Registered Opticians have liability insurance in order to have their certificates of registration (certificate) issued, renewed or reinstated. COO recognizes that registrants may need or want to stop practising in Ontario for a variety of personal and professional reasons. Those registrants may not want to resign or suspend their certificate with COO, but they also may not want to maintain insurance coverage while they are not employed.<sup>1</sup>

COO does not currently have an "inactive" class of membership<sup>2</sup> which would permit a registrant to remain registered without requiring insurance coverage. However, the regulation does permit uninsured registrants to remain registered provided they undertake not to practise while they are uninsured.

Accordingly, we have developed this policy to establish the process to follow when a registrant requests non-practising status with COO, as well as the steps that are required for a registrant with non-practising status to return to practise in Ontario.

#### What is Non-Practising Status?

As noted above, COO does not currently have a non-practising or inactive class of registration. Nonpractising status is recognition that a person is still a Registered Optician, but they have agreed not to practise opticianry in Ontario until certain conditions are met (namely, they submit evidence of insurance). The registrant's status on COO's public register will be "Non-Practising", which will make it clear to the public that the registrant, although registered with COO, is not permitted to practice opticianry in Ontario.

#### **Requesting Non-Practising Status**

A registrant who does not have professional liability insurance may change their status to non-practising by signing and delivering an <u>Undertaking Form</u> to COO. In order to obtain non-practising status, the registrant must agree to:

- 1. not practise opticianry in Ontario while the registrant has non-practising status;
- not supervise or direct a student or intern optician while the registrant has non-practicing status;
- 3. not to dispense under the delegation of a registrant of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario or the College of Optometrists of Ontario;
- 4. provide information to COO, renew their certificate annually and pay all registration fees required under the Opticianry Act, the Regulations and COO's by-laws;
- 5. fulfill the mandatory continuing education requirements of the Quality Assurance Program; and
- 6. have the fact of the undertaking posted on COO's public register.

Upon receipt of an acceptable undertaking, COO will change the registrant's status to non-practising, notify the registrant of the change and update the public register. Due to constraints of our current system, we are not able to note the change in the register in the short term. However, we are updating our system to allow for us to make note of the registrant's status as Non-Practising going forward.

We remind registrants that breaching the terms of the undertaking would be considered professional misconduct, and could result in disciplinary action by COO or prosecution for unauthorized practice.

## Lifting the Non-Practising Status

A registrant may request to lift the Non-Practising Status in accordance with the terms of the undertaking in effect on their certificate by completing and submitting the following to the COO:

- 1. any address change information, and
- 2. a <u>Certificate of Being Insured Under a Professional Liability Insurance Policy</u>.

While we will make every effort to process status change applications in a timely manner, we urge registrants to consult with COO's registration team prior to making any employment arrangements. A registrant will not be eligible to practise until COO confirms that their undertaking has been lifted and that their status has been updated on the register.
